

# KANSASWORKS

The **Kansas Department of Commerce** administers the **KANSASWORKS** workforce system, which links businesses, job seekers, educational institutions and training providers to ensure the state's workforce is equipped to meet industry needs.

Services offered at 30 workforce centers throughout the State include but are not limited to:

- Traditional job posting through the KANSASWORKS website
  - After creating an account employers have access to all resumes in the KANSASWORKS database
- The Topeka workforce center engages roughly 1,500 individuals a month (prior to Covid-19)
- All services provided are free for employers and individuals
- Topeka provides 4 hour job fairs twice weekly that receive on average 30 job seekers each session (Prior to Covid-19)
- KANSASWORKS hosts one big annual job fair in March with roughly 1,500 employers
- All 30 KANSASWORKS workforce centers have KHPOP and Heartland Works grant representatives
  - The Heartland Works and KHPOP programs facilitate grant assistance to individuals seeking their CNA, CMA, LPN, and RN licenses
  - The Heartland grant is a little easier to obtain even if the individual makes over the specified income level
  - The KHPOP assistance can be used to gradually move up the healthcare profession ladder while the Heartland program is more specific to obtaining a particular licensure
  - Both programs work with most colleges and community colleges in Kansas, and the representatives at KANSASWORKS will case manage individuals who apply for and seek grants through the respective programs
